RISE (3rd-8th) & UtahAspire+ (9th) Testing - May 2-20

Our state-mandated end of year (EOY) standardized assessments RISE and UtahAspire+ start next week. All 3rd-8th graders will participate in the RISE assessments and 9th graders will take the UtahAspire+ assessment. 3rd-8th grade RISE assessments measure student mastery of grade level standards in Language Arts, Math, Science and Writing (5th 4 8th only). I have included our Renaissance school testing schedule below, as well as information about which grade levels test in each subject area for both RISE and UtahAspire+. As much as possible, please refrain from keeping your student home from school on the dates listed below when they are scheduled to take an assessment.

RISE Assessments (3rd-8th - not time-restricted)

3rd-8th Language Arts & Math (approx. 90-120 minutes duration)
4th-8th Science (approx. 90-120 minutes duration)
5th & 8th Writing (approx. 60-90 minutes duration)
*3rd-8th graders will receive a proficiency score from 1-4 on each subject assessed (1=Below Proficient, 2=Approaching Proficiency, 3=Proficient, 4=Highly Proficient)

UtahAspire+ (9th only - time-restricted)

9th Reading (75 minutes) 9th English (45 minutes) 9th Math (75 minutes) 9th Science (60 minutes)

*9th grade students will receive a proficiency score on each test taken, as well as a predictive ACT score based on overall performance.

RISE OPT-OUT

All students are encouraged to participate in EOY testing to demonstrate their achievement and mastery of grade level standards in the subjects assessed. Student achievement data provides important and useful information about student learning, growth and achievement for our teachers and school. 
2021-2022 Parent Exclusion Opt-Out Form

RA CARPOOL REMINDERS

This information is specifically for carpool numbers over 350 that use the 'red zone' for pickup.

We have noticed some confusion around the rules for waiting in line at dismissal, and wanted to clarify. Our main priority is of course the safety of our students and drivers. Dismissal is moving faster and is more efficient each day. Please do your part to ensure it continues to run smoothly and safely and is fair for all.

BEFORE 3PM

Wait in the main line unless invited forward by a faculty member.

Our biggest problem has been cars cutting the line and pulling into the 'red zone' to wait before 3pm. Our 'red zone' only fits about 10 cars. If everyone feels they can pull through to park and wait, it gets overfilled and blocks both red AND blue cars from being able to move forward after the bell rings.

It is also difficult for staff to enter driveline numbers in that area as the internet is spotty. Please only pull through once your number has been entered and a faculty member has ushered you through. Otherwise, remain waiting in the main line.

AFTER 3PM

Continue to wait in the main line until you reach the entrance of the school. You may pull forward in the left lane and into the 'red zone' ONCE YOU GET TO THE CIRCLE at the entrance of the school. This is a safe space to create two lanes of entry. Please DO NOT pull out of the main line until you reach this area. The t-junction is NOT a safe place to have three lanes of traffic.

We continue to monitor and make adjustments to our procedure as needed, and appreciate the courtesy shown to those that assist in directing traffic each day. Thank you!


